The total impact of the McDonald's System on the economy of Cook County amounted to approximately \$2 billion in the 12 months ending June 30, 2022.

Increasing representation

Approximately 28% of McDonald's brand restaurant owner-operators in Chicagoland (including Northwest Indiana) are from underrepresented groups.*
