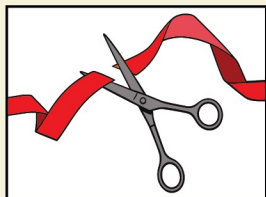


A TASTE OF McDonald's HISTORY

The first McDonald's restaurant opened in 1940 in San Bernardino, California.

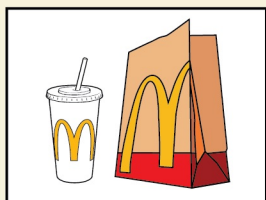
1953

1979

The Happy Meal has been on family road trips since 1979. Today, McDonald's distributes around 1.5 billion toys annually, more than any toy store in the world.

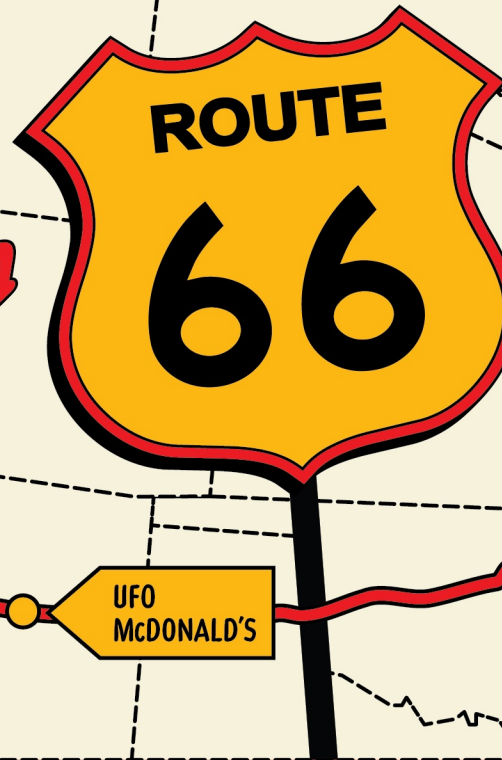

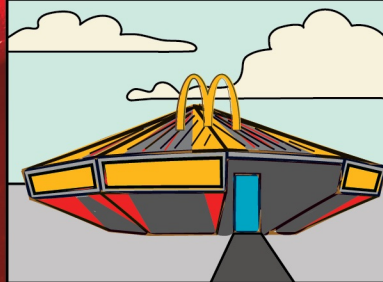
TURQUOISE ARCHES
